City of Monroe Hosting Community Meeting to Improve Parks

(Monroe, LA) The City of Monroe and Carbo Landscape Architecture are hosting a community engagement meeting to gather ideas on ways to improve Forsythe, Charles Johnson, and Chennault Parks as a part of a parks master plan.

Community members are invited to participate in the meeting, which will be held at the outdoor pavilion at the Louisiana Purchase Gardens and Zoo on Wednesday, November 30, 2022. Community input activities will be from 3:00-5:30 p.m., followed by a holiday movie in the park at 6:00 p.m. There will be lots of ways to share your ideas, as well as fun family-oriented events with food trucks, hot cocoa, an appearance from Santa.

To improve Forsythe, Charles Johnson, and Chennault Parks as a cohesive system, the City of Monroe has commissioned a parks master plan led by Carbo Landscape Architecture. Mayor Friday Ellis spearheaded the parks master planning effort as a part of his campaign to improve Monroe's public amenities. "Community feedback must be the foundation of the project's design to ensure that the parks best serve the people of Monroe. The work we're doing is the natural next step in improving the quality of life in the City of Monroe," says Mayor Ellis.

The consultant team held stakeholder meetings and conducted on-site research and data collection in October to gather baseline information on the site and user groups in preparation for the upcoming community meetings. In November, the consultant team and the City of Monroe are hosting a community engagement event to gather information from the residents of Monroe on how they would like to use their parks. All information collected from stakeholders, research, and the community will inform an initial concept for each park. Carbo Landscape Architecture will check back in with the

people of Monroe, hosting another public event to confirm the plans reflect the community's vision. Comments will be collected and incorporated into the final plans. The master plan is scheduled to be completed in six months and will provide the City with a road map of implementable improvements for each park.

Shannon Blakeman, managing principal with Carbo Landscape Architecture, noted that, "the parks system has immense potential, and we are looking forward to hearing how people want to use them now and in the future."
